COVID GUIDANCE

It is no longer mandatory to wear face coverings in church, although people are free to do so if they wish. There is a general encouragement to wear face coverings while singing, however it is recognised that not everyone will feel able to do this. Holy Communion can now be received on the hand or on the tongue in the normal Holy Communion procession, however the distribution of the Precious Blood is not being reintroduced at this time. The availability of holy water, the reintroduction of the sign of peace and the use of hymn books will be considered in the coming weeks.

MEMORIAL OF SAINT JOSEPHINE BAKHITA – 8TH FEBRUARY

Josephine was a young Sudanese girl sold into slavery and brought to Italy where, while serving as a nanny, she was sent to live with the Canossian Sisters of the Institute of the Catechumens in Venice. There she was baptised and, having reached majority age, was granted her freedom by Italian law. She died after a long and painful illness during which she would cry out to the Lord: 'Please loosen the chains...they are so heavy!' Her dying words were 'Our Lady, Our Lady!'
